#### 1. Steps to Join

The first step is to go to **<u>lls.org/community</u>** on your browser.

Then, click "Join Now." From here, you'll be taken to our registration page.

We recommend that you use the same display name you used on the Discussion Boards



so you can find your friends easily. Your display name does not need to be your actual name.

Fill out the rest of the information on the form. Rest assured that you can adjust your privacy settings so that only LLS staff sees your name, email, and date of birth.

Click Register.
