

## LLS 2023 Patient Financial Assistance Programs Household Income Requirements

LLS assists families whose income is at or below **600%** the U.S. Federal Poverty Level (FPL) guidelines FPL and considers the family's Cost of Living Index (COLI) when determining their financial eligibility. LLS will factor in your COLI at the time of application by using your zip code.

## Federal Poverty Level (FPL)

An income threshold that varies by family size, which outlines the estimated minimum income required for a household to buy such things as food, clothing and shelter.

## Cost-of-Living Index (COLI)

Cost of living is the amount of money needed to sustain a certain level of living, including basic expenses such as housing, food, taxes and health care. Cost of living is often used to compare how expensive it is to live in one city versus another. Cost of living varies widely across the United States.
